THE UNITED NATIONS DECLARATION ON THE RIGHTS OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES (UNDRIP) HAS BEEN AFFIRMED AS AN INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS INSTRUMENT

With financial assistance provided through a government program, we have the opportunity to conduct community consultation sessions to review existing federal and provincial laws, policies and programs for alignment with UNDRIP, and make a submission that identifies measures that will advance the implementation of the United Nations Declaration in Canada.
